

Basics of Online Resources at CSEL (access through eLibrary.unm.edu/csel/)

- **LIBROS** is a catalog of the books and journals that the library owns. It does not include article titles or article authors. Use the title search to find out if we have a journal, and if we do then look at the “library has” field to see which issues we have. Check the location as well as the call number and status. The location CSEL refers to our books and is downstairs. Journals can be in the new issues area or in the bound issues area.
- **Gold Rush** is a database of all journals that you can access online.
- **Article indexes** such as SciSearch, PsycINFO, and Biosis index many different journals and find which articles have been written on your topic. You then use the information the database provides to see if our library has the journal issues you need. You use LIBROS to check the journal title and holdings. These databases include many journals that our library does not have and so you may need to use interlibrary loan. Certain databases such as General Science Abstracts, Applied Science and Technology, and Basic Biosis (all on Firstsearch) have citations from journals that we likely subscribe to.
- **Full text** databases include the entire article as well as the citation. So you do not need to go find the journal to get the article. We have several new products that include some or all full text. These include EBSCOHost, Lexis-Nexis, and WilsonSelect (Firstsearch). These databases are best for general subject searching.
- **Electronic journals** are online versions of traditional journals or journals that are only in electronic form. You can find them through LIBROS or directly on the web page.
