### **Dean of University Libraries**

Responsible for creating the vision, environment, and resources necessary to provide a high level of library services for a diverse, complex, forward thinking research level one flagship academic institution. The University Libraries contain over 2 million volumes and include four libraries, Centennial Science and Engineering Library, Fine Arts & Design Library, Parish

Memorial Library (business and economics), and Zimmerman Library (education, humanities and social sciences) which also houses the Center for Southwest Research and Special Collections. The Dean oversees approximately 150 staff and faculty librarians, a budget of over 13 million dollars, and serves as a senior leader within the University administration.

***Texas A&M University Libraries - College Station, TX October 2000 – July 2007***

**Associate Dean for Information and Collection Services January 2007 – July 2007**

Provide leadership, direction, and operational support to a large, complex university library service division. The division includes 45 professional library faculty and 80 staff members within the reference, instruction, liaison, collection development, acquisitions, and cataloging units as well as branch libraries. Responsible for a collection budget of approximately ten million dollars. Serve as a member of the Dean's cabinet charged to create vision, strategic plans, establish priorities and policies for library services supporting over 50,000 users statewide.

**Associate Dean for Advanced Studies August 2003 – December 2006**

Provide leadership in planning, developing, implementing, and evaluating user-oriented, technologically advanced library services for a division comprised of all public services units and three branch libraries. Also responsible for collection development and selection of library materials supported by 35 faculty librarians in the 5<sup>th</sup> largest university in the U.S., serving 45,000 students with a staff of 251 and a total budget of over 26 million dollars.

*Key accomplishments* include integration of multiple service points for improved user services; implementing web based desktop delivery of any document within our own collections as well as through interlibrary loan; creating a new team based organizational structure; streamlining a complex fund structure for a twelve million dollar collection budget; development visits and activities with donors; and successful faculty recruitments. In addition, as representative to the Texas A&M System Library Directors group made resources available system-wide by leading efforts at promoting joint licensing and bringing grant funds for innovative projects.

**Associate Dean and Director, Medical Sciences Library October, 2000 – December 2006**

Provide direction and oversight for all operations of a 44,000 square foot academic research medical and veterinary sciences library with an annual budget of 3.5 million dollars.

*Key accomplishments* include complete refurbishment of all public spaces; collaborative creation of a strategic plan; Principal Investigator for a \$400,000 IMLS grant to recruit health sciences librarians; and the successful completion of library studies for four national accreditations at the TAMUS Health Sciences Center. Supported and raised awareness about scholarly communications issues throughout campus. Instituted web based document delivery and interlibrary loan as well as extensive involvement in national, regional, and state-wide consortia.

**Associate Dean for Digital Initiatives August 2002 – August 2003**

Led the team responsible for the development and policies for a comprehensive University Libraries coordinated web environment, including the purchase of a state of the art web Content Management System (Vignette), full text linking and federated search system (Ex Libris' SFX and Metalib) and Virtual Reference system and service. Investigated and provided foundation for later development of the library institutional repository (TxSpace).

**Health Sciences Library, Associate Director for Library Services 1998 – 2000**

Served as a senior manager in an academic medical center library with 323,316 volumes, 3,900 serials, and 65 FTE staff and a budget of \$6 million. Chaired the Library Management Council.

Created a single point of service and referral replacing four underutilized ones; participated in envisioning the services and use of a totally renovated space; and worked closely with the UNC School of Library and Information Services on grants and projects of joint interest.

Managed a department made up of three units: Reference, Circulation, and Bibliographic Access. Served as a member of the library senior management team charged with creating library wide policies, priorities, and budgets.
