Finding Articles: Research Databases - University Libraries

Bibliography of Native North Americans (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
Provides indexing of citations for books, essays, journal articles and government documents about Native American culture, history, and life in the United States and Canada. Topics include health and social policy.

Business Source Complete (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
Provides indexing and some full-text of articles related to management, public administration, public health, and healthcare, including coverage of issues related to Native American health services.

Econlit (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
Provides indexing and some full-text of leading economic journals, as well as journals in public administration, healthcare, and public policy. Some coverage of Native American health issues.

EthnicNewsWatch (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
News from ethnic, minority, and Native press in the United States. Major area of focus is ethnic area studies, but also covers healthcare, economics, education, environment, political science, and sociology.

PAIS (Public Affairs International) (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
Provides indexing and abstracts of journal articles, books, and government documents related to public affairs and public policy. Some coverage of Native American health, public health, and health policy.

PubMed (Free Internet access) Provides access to Medline, the National Library of Medicine's database of bibliographic citations and abstracts in the fields of medicine and health care.

Sociological Abstracts (Off-campus access for UNM community with a CIRT NetID)
Provides indexing and abstracts of journal articles related to sociology, social sciences, and behavioral sciences. Some coverage of Native American health, psychology, and community development.
