Scholarly Communication Fellowship Digital Initiatives & Scholarly Communication (DISC) The University of New Mexico

The Scholarly Communication Fellowship is awarded to a graduate student enrolled at the University of New Mexico to assist in the digital preservation and dissemination of the scholarship, research and cultural works created by UNM in freely accessible platforms including the UNM Digital Repository. This fellowship will provide a broad introduction to scholarly communication processes and concepts such as open access publication.

Duties and Responsibilities

The fellow will work closely with DISC faculty and staff to help migrate UNM theses, dissertations, and faculty publications to the UNM Digital Repository (digitalrepository.unm.edu), where they will be accessible for campus and community researchers. The fellow will also support the digitization, description and uploading of materials held by the library and the Center for Southwest Research into various DISC platforms.

In addition, they will provide outreach and end user support for these platforms. Depending on the fellow's research interests, there are opportunities for the creation of digital exhibits showcasing UNM research, text encoding or other digital humanities projects.

Terms of the Award

The award is for \$16,000. The fellow will work 20 hours each week during the fall and spring semesters including finals week and the week before the start of classes in both the fall and the spring. University-wide holidays are exempted. The fellow is required to give a short research presentation in Spring 2022 relating to the work accomplished during the fellowship.

Selection Criteria

Required:

- Graduate student in residence at the University of New Mexico with a minimum of 6 credit hours of course work, thesis or dissertation hours which count towards the graduate degree
- Good writing, communication, organization and time management skills.
- Experience using Microsoft Windows, Microsoft Office and Adobe Acrobat.
- Some knowledge of HTML and CSS.
- Legally authorized to work in the United States

Preferred:

- Academic degree or focus on New Mexico history & culture, Education, Political Science, Chicana(o)/Native American Studies, Women's Studies, American Studies or related disciplines.
- Experience in graphic design or website management.

Application Requirements

- Letter of application specifically addressing the selection criteria
- Two letters of recommendation from individuals familiar with applicant's academic and work experience; letters should include telephone numbers for verification
- Applicant's resume/curriculum vitae
- Completed application form
